User sets up her personal information, indicating she is an immigrant student.




The system matches the immigrant student to a student of a different nationality and gives her information to meet him.




The user finds the table where she meets her cultural exchange lunch buddy!



User realizes it's the first day of school tomorrow and wants to find someone new to sit with.




User opens the app and logs in with her UW NetID.




App asks to confirm that the demographic and schedule information on file is correct.

2. Amy meets jil at the event. Jill is interested in knowing how things in the U.S. compare to China.






 Jill finds the resource on the UW website and sees posts by Amy sharing her culture online.




5. Jill thinks that it's awesome and decides to share the differences between growing up in Ohio and how the culture there compares to Seattle's culture,







The use drives at the Hub alone and notices there is no open tables.



User pulls out their phone to get encouragement to sit with Strengers





The use meks two new friends




The user sits at home alone dreading lunch time on Monday




The user checks their calender to see it empty
